


# How To Make Your Own Proportional Divider

And start drawing like a pro!




### What you will need:


- Foam board 2 pieces 1 cm x 35 cm
- 1x thumb tack or drawing pin
- A small piece of prestik (from Bostik in SA or blu tack from Bostik in USA)
- Black marker
- Ruler
- Sharp craft knife



We use foam board because it is lightweight and easy to cut and shape. However, if you are handy with power tools, you can use a variety of materials



Do this down the one side only. When you assemble your proportional Divider, you will need to match up these dots with each other to maintain the proportion and scale when you are drawing



The side labelled 1 is your short side or the side that you will use to get your initial measurement from your photographic or live subject.

The side on the right labelled 2 is the side that you will use to transfer the measurement to your surface.

Securing the Proportional Divider in a way that it may pivot when needed but hold firm when you need to transfer number 2 to your surface, is vital. So it is recommended that you work really gently with your new drawing tool.
